18" Division: 2A. Power and Speed 2B. First round with Jump Off
2C. Fault and Out 2D. Rotating Pair Relay 2E. Take Your Own Line

2' Division: 3A. Power and Speed 3B. First round with Jump Off
3C. Fault and Out 3D. Rotating Pair Relay 3E. Take Your Own Line

Up to 2'6" Division: 4A. Power and Speed 4B. First round with Jump Off
4C. Fault and Out 4D. Rotating Pair Relay 4E. Take Your Own Line

Up to 3' Division: 5A. Power and Speed 5B. First round with Jump Off
5C. Fault and Out 5D. Rotating Pair Relay 5E. Take Your Own Line

3'6" & up choice of height Division: 6A. Power and Speed 6B. First round with
Jump Off
6C. Fault and Out 6D. Rotating Pair Relay 6E. Take Your Own Line

First Round w/ Jump Off: Table II, Sec. 2 (b)-If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or after the tone) will be considered to have retired from the jump-off.

Power and Speed: Table II, Sec. 2 (c)- The first phase to consist of 8 to 10 jumping efforts and the second phase (immediate jump-off) of 5 to 7 jumping efforts. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the designated jump-off course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line for the initial course. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off, in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults. The use of a Time Allowed is optional in the first round.

Fault and Out (Table II, Sec. 4)-The competitor's round finishes with the first fault incurred under Table II. Points are awarded instead of faults, two points being awarded for each obstacle jumped cleanly and one point for the obstacle knocked down. The winner is the competitor who scores the greatest number of points. Time will decide in the event of equality of points.

Rotating Pair Relay. This competition is for teams of two. The entire course must be jumped in the correct order by either competitor. The competitor who crosses the start line must jump the first obstacle and the competitor who jumps the last obstacle must cross the finish line. In the event of a disobedience, the other competitor must first jump the obstacle which has not been jumped by his partner and then continue the course. Faults incurred are penalized by adding four seconds for each occurrence to the time of the round. The first two disobediences are penalized only by time, the third disobedience incurs elimination. Should a competitor jump an obstacle before his partner has landed over preceding obstacle, the pair will be eliminated. The fastest overall time wins. In case of a tie for first place only, there will be a compulsory jump-off over a shortened course. *Bring your friends or secretary will happily form a pair for you!*

Take Your Own Line. After crossing the start line, the competitor must jump each obstacle in either direction, in any order and cross the finish line. Faults counted.

Attire: Rider- polo/collared shirt and breeches with boots preferred, schooling attire ok. Horse- running martingales only, boots as desired. Helmet with harness required, safety vest allowed.

** To qualify for any series end awards/prizes- Points accumulated for each horse/rider combination and they must attend min. of 4. Trainer award (will be money!) you must be in attendance and have students

riding in 5 of the 6 shows. Winners must be present at the last show to accept and receive any prize(s)/award(s). Prizes may include saddle pads, bridles, cash, gift certificates, and other prizes. We reserve the right to combine or cancel divisions as needed (ex. Less than 6 entries per division). For Divisional series end awards: division must have run at 5 of the 6 shows, and had at least 6 riders qualified, at the discretion of WVEC.
